Forgione Tutoring College Prep: Year at a Glance

While our services are individualized to meet the needs of each student, all of our students have similar college application deadlines, which determine the general flow of our year.

	Class of 2024	Class of 2025
Winter/Spring	1 st or 2 nd take of SAT or ACT	Diagnostic testing to decide on ACT or SAT prep
Summer	2 nd or 3 rd take of SAT or ACT College Application Essays	Preparation begins for ACT or SAT

SAT/ACT Score Improvement Goals

When we begin working with new students, we help them set attainable goals for score improvement and help them understand that their results will depend to a large extent on the effort they put into learning and practicing for the test. Our general guidelines for expected score growth are:

SAT: 100-150 points after 24 hours of test prep ACT: 3-4 points after 30 hours of test prep

For students completing fewer hours, the expected improvement may be less, though many students can exceed these expectations with consistent hard work. Other students choose

to continue preparing even after reaching their goals, making increases of 200 points on the SAT or 5 points on the ACT attainable.

Test Prep Program Details

The SAT and ACT cover a lot of material, and students sometimes underestimate the time and practice required to see gains. Most students work with us for 3-6 months to reach their goals.

Comprehensive Program

Covers all test subjects and requires 2-3 hours per week over 12-20 weeks. Many students stretch these hours throughout a 3-9 month period, often taking the test more than once.

Comprehensive ACT (4 subjects): 30 hours recommended Comprehensive SAT (3 subjects): 24 hours recommended

Subject Area Focus

Concentrates on 1-2 test subjects at a time, which limits the number of tutoring hours and homework load per week but lengthens the number of weeks required to cover all subjects.

1 test subject: 8-10 hours and 1 hour per week (8-10 weeks) 2 test subjects: 16-20 hours and 1.5-2 hours per week (10 weeks)

Reminder for Students Taking February and March Tests

If you are taking a February ACT, March SAT, or March ACT, make sure you have plans in place for tutoring after the test. <u>2-3 weeks</u> before your test, let a Director or your tutor know which scheduling option you would like:

- 1. Continue tutoring without pause with the same tutoring schedule for another test attempt
- 2. Discontinue after the test
- 3. Request to hold your spot for two weeks after the test (holds are approved under specific circumstances and require approval by a Director).
 - a. We can approve holds only for national, Saturday, test dates as those scores are released 10-14 days after the test.
 - b. We cannot hold slots for students waiting on scores from a school-day administration as those can take 3-5 weeks to be released.
- 4. Transition to a different subject focus (e.g. from Reading/English to Math/Science.)

If you are unsure what the right schedule or testing plan should be, reach our to your tutor or one of our Directors.

School-day ACT

To prepare our students for the school-day ACT, we are attempting to maintain a record of the dates when schools are offering it and whether it will be on paper or computer. If not mentioned, our understanding is that the test will be administered on paper.

SAT & ACT Mock and Diagnostic Testing

Mock and diagnostic tests are offered in midtown Raleigh and Cary at no additional cost.

- For students undecided about SAT vs. ACT and are at the beginning stages of the preparation, we recommend taking both an SAT and ACT diagnostic, especially if they did not take a recent PSAT or pre-ACT.
- Mock testing measures students' progress and gives us information to help students prepare for the actual test. <u>Students should take a mock test as a simulation 2-3 weeks</u> <u>before the real test.</u>
- We offer simulations for those students approved for extended time but those are usually dates other than our regular Sunday mock testing schedule. Additional extended time tests can be scheduled by request.
- Please contact a Director to schedule a mock or diagnostic test. An updated list of testing dates will be mass emailed periodically.

The Digital PSAT (2023) and SAT (2024)

We have begun preparing for the computer-based PSAT and SAT, analyzing the new tests that have been made available and preparing test prep materials for them. The switch to the digital PSAT takes effect in 2023 and to the digital SAT in March of 2024.

Regular attendance is necessary to achieve significant score gains. If attendance drops below 50% for a specific time slot in any 4 week period, we may offer the slot to someone else. Let your tutor know if you anticipate any schedule conflicts.
